



#### Content & Grade-Level Celebrations

- 3rd grade ELA proficiency increased from 40.9% to 51.1%
- 3rd and 4th graders showed the highest gains in math with a 12% increase, followed by 7th graders with an 11.4% increase
- 3rd graders showed the largest increase in science proficiency with a 20.9% gain.
- The largest increases in social studies proficiency were for 7th graders with a 5.2% gain and in U.S. history with a 4.5% gain.




