

TITLE I SCHOOLWIDE PROGRAM STATUS

Based upon the percentage of the student population that is economically disavantaged, some Title I schools qualify for schoolwide program status. A schoolwide Title I program has the advantage of using Title I funds across all programs in the building for the purpose of boosting academic performance for the school as a whole, rather that targeting only certain students.

Four schools in Bristol City qualify and are served under the Title I schoolwide option. These schools are Anderson Elementary, Avoca Elementary, Fairmount Elementary, and Vance Middle School.

Each of the Title I schools in Bristol City must plan annually for the use of Title I funds. These plans must meet the individual needs of the school and must be developed by a committee that must conclude parent input. Each school's plan for the use of Title I funds must then meet with system approval.

Additionally, all Title I schoolwide schools must hold annual meetings to which parents are invited for the purpose of sharing input. At these meetings, the following information must be provided to parents:

- Title I programs and activities carried out with Title I funds
- Title I parent involvement requirements
- Curriculum available under Title I
- Academic assessments and proficiency levels of students required under Title I
