IOWA Algebra I Readiness Assessment	February 24, 2025	Identified 6-7 <sup>th</sup> graders	The IOWA Algebra Readiness Assessment will be administered to identified 6 <sup>th</sup> and 7 <sup>th</sup> graders. <b>Test Length: 50 minutes</b>	Data will be shared with parents to determine advanced math placement in grades 7 and 8.

ACT Exam/ Online (Tentative Dates)  <i>English Math Reading Science</i>	March 12 – 14 (Juniors)  October 1, 2024 (Senior retake)	11  12	The ACT Assessment will be administered to all juniors during the school day. The ACT is a college readiness assessment administered to evaluate high school achievement and college readiness. <b>Test Length: 3 – 3.5 hours</b>	Individual Student Reports are released to parents by ACT.
SAT Exam PSAT <i>Language Math Reading</i>	To Be Determined	11 or 12  10 or 11	The SAT will be an option for juniors and seniors during the school day in the fall. The SAT is used to measure a high school student's readiness for college. <b>Test Length: 3 – 3.5 hours</b>	Individual Student Reports will be shared with parents and students when released by the College Board.

<p><b>TCAP-Alt for Grades 3-11: ELA &amp; Math</b>    <i>Test Length: 4 – 6 hours</i>    <b>Fall (September 9 – December 20, 2024)</b>    <b>Spring (February 3 – May 16, 2025)</b></p> <p><b>TCAP-Alt for Grades 3-11: Science &amp; Social Studies</b>    <b>Spring (March 10 – April 25, 2025)</b></p> <p><i>Reading, Math, Science, Social Studies</i></p> <p>TCAP-Alt includes alternative assessments available to students with disabilities for whom participation in the regular state assessment is inappropriate, even with the use of extensive accommodations. Approximately one percent of the students' population will participate in alternative assessments. The TCAP-Alternate will include the Multi-State Alternate Assessment (MSAA) in English language arts and math, as well as the TCAP-Alternate assessment in science and social studies. The MSAA is designed to be administered online and the TCAP-Alternate science and social studies is designed to be administered via paper.</p>

<p><b>WIDA ACCESS: Test Length: 3 – 3.5 hours</b>    <b>(Feb. 3 – March 28, 2025)</b></p> <p><i>Reading, Writing, Speaking, Listening</i></p> <p>Placement test for ESL services</p> <p>Required by Federal Govt. (ESSA) to assess student's progress in acquiring English</p>
<p><b>NAEP: Test Length: 1 – 1.5 hours</b>    <b>(January 27 – March 7, 2025)</b></p> <p><i>Reading, Math, Science</i></p> <p>Required by Federal Govt. (ESSA) to assess reading, math, and science skills</p>
